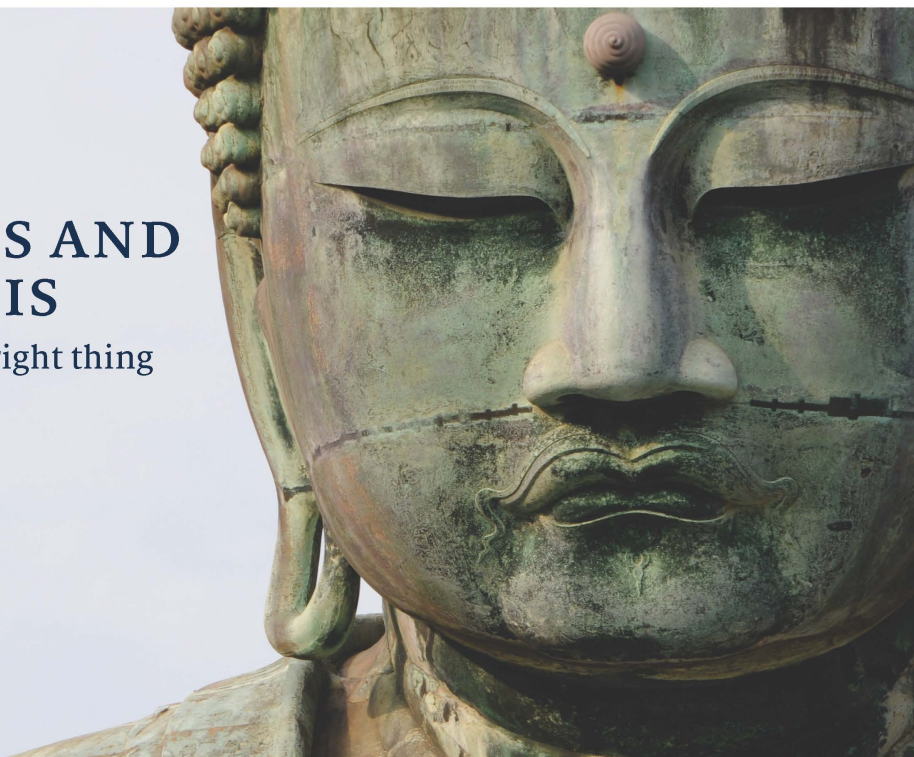

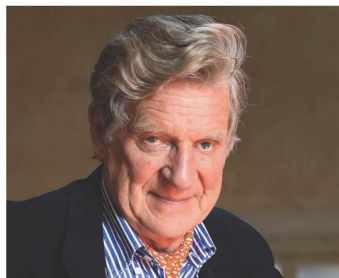

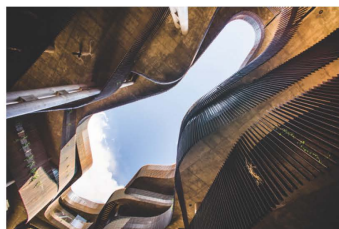

Robert Thurman is the Jey Tsong Khapa Professor of Indo-Tibetan Buddhist Studies at Columbia University. He is also president and co-founder of Tibet House U.S., a non-profit organization dedicated to the preservation and promotion of Tibetan civilization, and president of the American Institute of Buddhist Studies. Thurman was named one of *Time Magazine's* 25 most influential Americans and has been profiled by *The New York Times* and *People Magazine*.
